

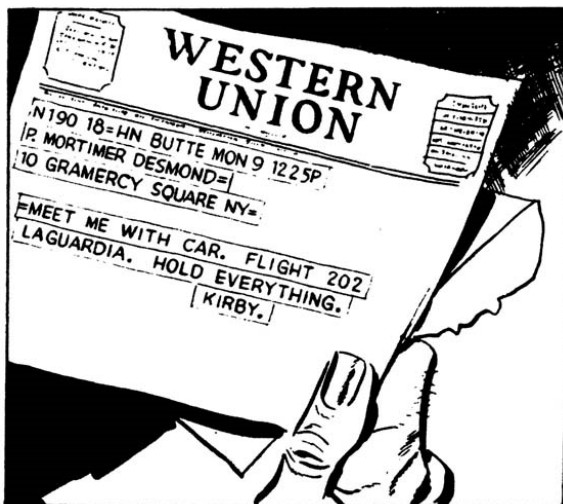

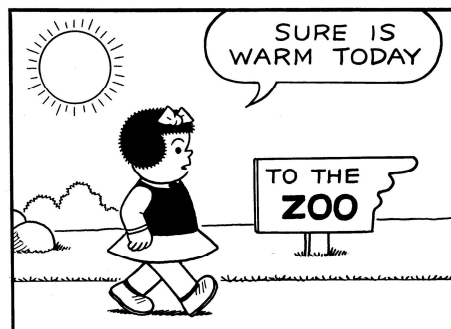

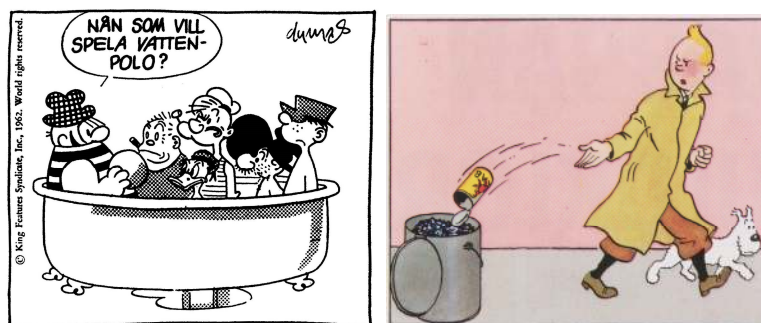

- **Rickenbacker guitar** – Gives us the last name of the celebrated World War I aviator Eddie Rickenbacker, co-creator of the comic strip.
- **The Universal logo** – Universal was the production company for the movie serial
- **Ace of spades** – A no brainer, Ace, first part of the title

- **Simon & Garfunkel: Cecilia** – one of the episodes is called "*Felix and Cecilia*"

- **Swedish pop duo First Aid Kit** – Mr. Walker's first name is Kit
- **Tina Turner** from the movie "*Mad Max Beyond Thunderdome*" – in the soundtrack she sang "*We Don't Need Another Hero*" – which of course is the name of the Phantom's horse
- **The comic strip Drago by Burne Hogarth** – The Phantom was called Dragos in many Swedish newspapers
